She joined the team from New Zealand where she worked as a herd health consultant and dairy vet for Anexa Animal Health in Hamilton in the North Island. She has a Masters in Veterinary Epidemiology with a research interest and PhD in calf health and colostrum management. Katie is experienced in teaching undergraduate and postgraduate students, as well as farmers and other vets; motivating people to make changes to improve farm profitability and sustainability.

Synopsis

Optimising colostrum management in dairy calves has multiple implications for calf health and long term productivity. There are many aspects to colostrum management which merit attention, including quality, quantity and timing of administration. In this webinar we explore the newest insights on colostrum from UK based science and the latest body of national and international research extolling the benefits of extended colostrum and transition milk feeding.

Since recent retirement he is focussing on improving skills in fly tying and fly fishing for trout and salmon.
